Mental Health Barriers to Learning in the Classroom

Mental Health can affect classroom learning and social interactions, both of which are critical to the success of students. Youth with emotional and behavioral disorders have the worst graduation rate of all students with disabilities. Nationally, only 40% of students with emotional, behavioral and mental health disorders graduate from high school, compared to the national average of 76%. Many estimates show that even though mental illness affects so many of our kids aged 6-17, as many as 80% do not receive the mental health care they need. However, if appropriate services are put in place to support a young person's mental health needs, we can often maximize success and minimize negative impacts for students. Mental health problems are common and they are treatable! Early detection and intervention strategies can help improve resilience and the ability to succeed in school & life (Association for Children's Mental Health).

According to PAYS data from 2017, **49%** of youth do not view using some drugs as risky. Parents and schools are protective factors that can buffer children and adolescents from risks they face (PAYS 2017).
